

# **County Champion**

JACK Brown says it feels 'special' to become the first player for 24 years to win the Men's County Championship whilst representing Kingsthorpe Golf Club.

Our Scratch team lead man fired rounds of 69 and 72 at Oundle to win the 2015 tournament for the second time as he finished three strokes ahead of a trio of players.

The 2013 winner follows in the footsteps of previous Kingsthorpe champions Ernie Speakman (1926), Mick Haddon (1981), Darren Jones (1987), Neil Goodman (1989) and Steve McDonald, who triumphed in 1982 and 1991.

Brown joked: "I'm not sure how happy Northants County are since I won with Brampton Heath and now Kingsthorpe, either side of playing for them!

"But it's great for Kingsthorpe, to have a county champion for the first time in many years - it's special to represent them.



"We are a good team and if we can now press on in the Hollingsworth Trophy and the Scratch League hopefully we can make it a hat-trick for the club this year. I think we can win them all."

Brown says joining Kingsthorpe this year has given him a fresh outlook on his golf after a difficult 12 months when his form and confidence dipped.

He admitted: "Last year I struggled a lot and almost packed the game up, so this was much tougher to win than the previous victory two years ago and because of that it fells an awful lot better.

"By having a break has motivated me a lot more. I've worked towards this for a long time - my only goal was to win this again. So to achieve the win, from my point of view is a great thing to do, I'm ecstatic."

Another new club member Roseanne Youngman came close to making it a double for Kingsthorpe in the Ladies County Championships as she was narrowly beaten in the semi-finals at Wellingborough Golf Club. Youngman had earlier knocked out defending champion Karen Lobb (Northants County) in the last eight on the 18th hole.

Kingsthorpe's next generation of champion golfers were also successful in the County Junior Championships at Overstone Golf Club. Turn to page 8 for more details.

# The 1908 Club Review - Knebworth Golf Club

KINGSTHORPE have reciprocal green fee arrangements to play golf at 23 different Golf Clubs who were also formed in 1908. This is Knebworth Golf Club, near Stevenage in Hertfordshire.

Reminiscent of Woburn, the opening hole sets the tone for the round as a player faces a 471 yard par four down and up to an elevated two tier green - it's a brute of a hole!

The club have held major competitions, and it's easy to see why because this hilly tree lined course, with it's lush fairways, is a superb test, as well as being a thoroughly enjoyable experience.

It boasts a good combination of par threes from the long fourth and 14th holes, to the well bunkered 146 yard eighth hole, while a round comes to completion with back-to-back par five holes.



It's not cheap to join or play, so a complimentary or reduced green fee should be treasured.

Mind you, with so many undulations it will certainly test the stamina so, for those whose legs aren't the strongest, a buggie is probably recommended.
