> You can keep up-to-date on all the social events at Harrowden Hall by visiting the Club website.



She said: "We currently have around 800 registered members of which over 300 attend the Centre weekly and we also see about 10 newly diagnosed each month.

"It costs £400,000 to keep the doors of the Centre open, this equates to £8,000 every week and £200 per hour. The Centre receives no government funding, so we need to find the full £400k every year, so thank you to Wellingborough Golf Club."

"He'd been a loyal member of the Club for a long time, he was a great sportsman, a good team player and he knew a lot of people. He loved Wellingborough Golf Club and he will be sadly missed."

Club Professional Ryan Evans said: "Kevin and his wife Rachael were two of my biggest supporters, particularly when I was competing as an amateur. They used to drive long distances to come and watch me play, including when I won the Berkshire Trophy (pictured below). I will always be grateful."

Ladies Club Captain Mary MacLaren said: "The Ladies section would like to offer their heartfelt condolences to Rachael and family after the sad passing of Kevin. He will be missed by all of us. You are in our thoughts and prayers."

Club Captain Martin Wall added: "Although I didn't know Kevin too well, I do know he will be greatly missed at the Club. It has been a difficult few weeks for Wellingborough with two more funerals and wakes at the Club in February as Norman Atkins and Graham Bush both died recently.

"Norman was a member for 30 years, while Graham, who was a good friend helped Wellingborough win the inaugural County Seniors Knockout Team event last year. They will all be missed."



Scratch League title defence starts at home

REIGNING champions Wellingborough meet the team they beat to the title last year in their opening fixture of 2018 as they host Northants County.

After a draw at County in their final match clinched the League for just the third time in club history, the men will go into the contest in confident mood.

Newly-promoted Kingsthorpe have a trip to Northampton first up, while Overstone Park host Peterborough Milton.

WELLINGBOROUGH Golf Club pro Kyson Lloyd Lloyd, who celebrated his 26th birthday towards will be hoping to build on the experience of playing in a pro tournament in Africa for the first time after finishing eighth in the Actuaries Open in Mongomo.

With 100 golfers from six continents taking part in the event in Equatorial Guinea, Lloyd carded four birdies in an opening 71.

He dropped just a single stroke in a round of 69 on the second day to move into the runners-up position going into the last round.

Despite carding back-to-back birdies on the sixth and seventh holes and picking up another shot on the 18th hole, he couldn't maintain his challenge as he finished with a score of 74.

After booking his spot in the tournament by winning a qualifying event in Dubai at the end of last season. Lloyd was full of praise for the event organisers.

He said: "Mongomo is such a great place, the hospitality we received was second to none.

"The course is one of the best I've ever played - the layout was so demanding and visually stunning because it rewarded good golf and punished bad golf. It was a good tournament golf course."

"We were looked after really well and the weather was great too. It was 30 degrees and the sun was

New greens, new bunkers, but the same natural environment

WITH Wellingborough Golf Club celebrating it's 125th anniversary in 2018, member David Wilson investigates all the significant changes that have occured at the club over the last century and a quarter. In the second of 12 monthly articles, he looks at the course alterations over the years.

WHEN Old Tom Morris played the first round on the The Club Captain's old Nest Farm course he spotted good potential. 1977 recorded that;

He stated that 'since the land was high, it would therefore always be dry under foot and the turf was of a very fine nature to make good greens without much trouble'.

Improvements were still to be made, including the purchase of sheep 'to keep the grass down'!

At Harrowden, the landscape of lakes, streams, woodland and a variety of specimen trees, both on the course and in the gardens, provided a perfect home for both wildlife and golfers.

Whilst preserving its natural environment, the Club has continued to improve this landscape for all abilities of golfers for over 40 years.

The drainage has improved beyond measure, while the ponds and trees have been carefully managed by experts.

When the Club bought Harrowden Hall for its clubhouse in 1974, the course had to be redesigned to bring the first tee and 18th green up to the end of the garden.

The old first tee became the 10th and the old 18th green became the ninth, while two par five's and a couple of short holes were also lost.

Improvements continued, before and after the new course was first played in 1982.

The Club Captain's Newsletter in October 1977 recorded that; 'Members have again experienced trouble and annoyance with areas of rough left for hay-making. This will not occur again! Bunkers will also require future attention. Approximately 50 tons of sand has been added during the season.'

The area between the third fairway and the fourth green was developed into a reservoir at the turn of the millennium so that the Club had its own guaranteed water supply.

The greens had always played well in the drier months but became soggy in the wet.

So, in 1999 the Club bit the bullet and had all the greens redesigned and reconstructed to USGA standards.

Since then, with good management and expert advice, the putting surfaces have become the envy of all who come.

Meanwhile the bunkers had been improved piecemeal over the years, but in 2017 it was agreed to completely re-structure, re-design, resand and re-turf them.

Helped by a dry late summer and autumn, the work was completed in November - a job well done!

Practice facilities now include; a putting green, a chipping area, a par three area behind the 17th green for young and old to sharpen up their short game, a practice bunker and a green area to the right of the eighth fairway and a large driving area further down The Slips.
