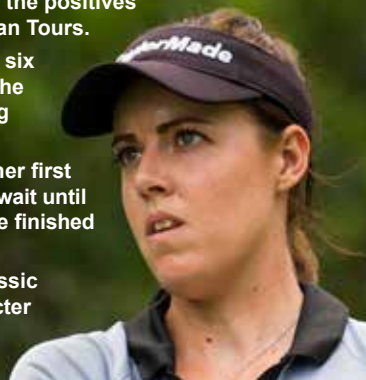
Ryan and Meghan are starting to make the cut on Tour

WELLINGBOROUGH member Roger Butler will end his stint as President of the Northamptonshire Golf Ltd when they hold their AGM later this month. Wellingborough Golf Club Magazine met up with Butler, who will hand over to club-mate Carol Gibbs, to discuss his two years in the role at the newly-merged body.

How do you reflect on the last two years?

It's been very enjoyable. It's been interesting watching some of the golf played, particularly the juniors, it's been great to watch them improve and stretch themselves. The highlight was seeing Callum Farr and Ben Jones shoot nine-under-par after just nine holes in foursomes in the England Golf County Boys Final against Yorkshire - it included five birdies and two eagles.

What about the other teams?

Ladies County Week was great to watch. Hopefully the results will come because there are a number of girls coming through. The men's first team came close in the Anglian League - just one game away from winning it. But we have three matches at Wellingborough this year, so if we go out and perform we have a very good chance.

Did you enjoy playing for the County Seniors?

They are a great bunch of guys. A big thank you to Mike Abbott for all the years that he has put in to Seniors Golf. Northamptonshire won the Anglian League for three years on the bounce under Mike.

As the first President of Northamptonshire Golf Ltd. How has the merger gone?

The company is in a good state, we have budgetary control, we know where we are spending the money and we still have some cash in the bank, which is not a bad thing to do. We are still in a good position to support the development of golf in Northamptonshire. The merger was always going to be a challenge but the board has worked together and the structures are in place to go forwards, and it can only improve. The NGL encompasses everything and everyone - all departments are given their fair chance now.

How supportive have the clubs been?

All the clubs deserve thanks for allowing the county to use their facilities, practice grounds, courses and venues for training sessions, competitions and matches over the last 24 months. And particularly to Wellingborough for being one of the first to put their hands up and say we could use the course for all first team matches for two years and to host the County Championships last year.



How did it feel to be part of Wellingborough's first Scratch League title in 33 years in 2017?

There aren't many County Presidents that have played on a winning Scratch League team, and remaining unbeaten as well - only two matches admittedly! But that was very good. The side was made up of youngsters and the more experienced golfers like myself and Gary Grimmitt, who are a bit more long in the tooth! Hopefully I'll be selected to play again this year - probably Milton away because I can usually get a result around there.

Fellow Wellingborough member Carol Gibbs takes over as NGL President. How will you help her?

It is a big job now that it is merged, just getting around the matches to try and encourage our players is a lot to do. Carol will do it her way and I will offer my support, of course.

So what is next for you - more golf?

Yes, playing golf took a little bit of a backward step for me, but up until recently I was playing uncompetitive mid-amateur golf, whereas now I'm in the Seniors section. I've already got my name down for the English and Welsh, and possibly the Scottish, so hopefully I will be playing a little more golf, instead of trying to take on these youngsters!

WELLINGBOROUGH have enjoyed a proud record in NGL team competitions in recent seasons as the men's, ladies and seniors have claimed the plaudits in knockout and league tournaments. With the 2018 campaign fast approaching, this is what our teams have to look forward to in the coming weeks.

Hollingsworth Trophy

WELLINGBOROUGH begin their attempt to win a second Hollingsworth Trophy crown in three years with a home clash against Priors Hall in Group B on Sunday, March 25th.

The 2016 champions travel to Rushden in their next match in April, host Kingsthorpe a fortnight later, before completing the campaign with a trip to Silverstone in mid-July.

With the top team in the group progressing through to the semi-finals, if Wellingborough are successful they will face defending champions Peterborough Milton, Oundle, Kettering, Whittlebury or Daventry.

Group A includes Brampton Heath, Cold Ashby, Collingtree, Stoke Albany and Farthingstone, while the other section is contested by last year's beaten finalists Northampton, Northants County, Overstone, Staverton and Kettering's B team.

Captains Charity: Ups N Downs



CLUB Captains Martin Wall, Mary MacLaren, Graham Bayes and Ellie Darnell are supporting two local charities in 2018 - Ups N Downs and Beds & Northants MS Therapy Centre. Throughout the year, Wellingborough Golf Club Magazine will keep you informed of exactly how and where your money is being spent. Thanks for your kind donations.

UPS N Downs support those with Down's Syndrome in Northamptonshire. We now help over 40 families with both emotional and practical help for all family members.

The success of our previous fundraisers has enabled us to maintain the level of support we have been able to offer to all our members since we began in 2006. We continue to go from strength to strength.

One of our many objectives is to support parents, both pre-natal and post-natal, to ensure they have the right information to be able to make an informed choice when given the diagnosis that their child will have Down's Syndrome.

We have prepared information packs which are placed in the maternity units in both Northampton and Kettering General Hospitals.

The packs contain real life stories of some of our families' journeys together with accurate information in relation to Down's Syndrome in an effort to dispel some of the myths that are commonly shared.



We are extremely proud to share that we are now funding a whole series of activities and training courses to further enhance the on-going development of all our children. These include:

- Speech and Language - Programme for all of our members on a monthly basis, crucial for the children as they will face complicated challenges in mastering and using speech, language and communication skills.
- Occupational Therapists - To work with our members to give specialist input into their sensory needs both within the home and school environment.
- 'Sing & Sign' sessions on a weekly basis and monthly Parent Tots sessions - These help all involved to develop key communication skills in their formative years.
- Weekly one-to-one swimming lessons - This builds general confidence and ability in the water. These take place in Kettering, Wellingborough and Oundle.
- Monthly family get-togethers at the Wacky Warehouse in Rushden - These enable all our members and their families to meet and share common experiences as well as giving our children the chance to exercise and enjoy the soft-play facilities available.
- Annual summer and Christmas events for all families.
- Provision of essential training for early years and primary school staff who do, and will in the future, take responsibility for our children.

In the past 12 months, more than 60 staff representing nurseries and pre-schools and 40 teachers and support staff representing 26 primary schools have undertaken bespoke training provided by the DSA in support of the learning profiles of children with Down's Syndrome.

During 2018 we would like to source further activities for our members including Creative and Expressive Workshops to build the confidence of our youngsters both on and off the stage.

Captains Charity: Beds & Northants MS Therapy Centre

THE Beds & Northants MS Therapy Centre has been providing advice, support and therapies to people with Multiple Sclerosis (MS) and their families for 35 years. We are the main provider within Northamptonshire and Bedfordshire.

Our aim is to help people to learn to manage their MS so that they can continue to lead independent and healthy lives on what is often a very difficult journey.

We offer services that help people to self-manage their condition, including MS Specialist Nurse, physiotherapy, hydrotherapy, hyperbaric oxygen, adapted gym, counsellor, dietician, and other complementary therapies.

We have a specially adapted minibus that collects people from their homes who would not otherwise be able to get to the MS Therapy Centre to receive the treatment they need.

We currently have around 800 members, over 300 of whom attend the MS Therapy Centre weekly. We currently also assess 10 new MS referrals every month, thus helping to support those who are newly diagnosed or now need our services.

We receive no government funding, and have to raise some £400,000 a year ourselves in order to keep going. Our small fundraising team, run predominantly by volunteers, work hard to hold regular events and engage with the community to encourage income growth and awareness.

The Beds & Northants MS Therapy Centre is run for people with MS by people with MS. We encourage members to get involved as much as they can.

Thank you so much for your support this year - it will be greatly appreciated by everyone at the MS Therapy Centre. We urge people to come and visit, - to gain a greater insight into the work that is carried out, so please do give us a call on 01234 325781 and come and see for yourself.

The Gazebo: An expensive restoration from The Wilderness

WITH Wellingborough Golf Club celebrating its 125th anniversary in 2018, member David Wilson investigates all the significant changes that have occurred at the Club over the last century and a quarter. In the third of 12 monthly articles, he looks at how a dilapidated building along the opening fairway changed from a useless and expensive eyesore to one of the course's most iconic features.

THE alterations to the course in 1982 involved bringing the first tee and the 18th green up to the end of the gardens, and this had revealed The Gazebo - an early 18th century summer house!

It had been built in the wilderness on the site of 'the quaint old summer house' where Charles I and his courtiers relaxed after playing bowls at Harrowden.

It was usual for a wealthy owner to have carefully maintained parterres and gardens near the house enclosed by wrought iron gates. Beyond was a less formal area known as 'The Wilderness'.

By Jane Austen's time (around 1800), as she describes in both 'Pride and Prejudice' and 'Mansfield Park', the Wilderness was a 'wild area of woodland which may have included a maze and shrubberies, where gentlemen and ladies could roam (to be close to nature or to have 'private moments').

After years of neglect, the Harrowden Gazebo was in an advanced state of dilapidation and the Club applied to demolish it.

Opposition came from local and national groups, The Department of the Environment, Wellingborough Council, English Heritage and individuals. An official enquiry considered the application in September 1981 and, as expected, it was refused.

The Club prevaricated for some time and asked for financial help from local organisations to preserve this ancient monument because the estimated restoration cost was £35-65,000.

No aid was forthcoming, neither was an agreement to a request to move The Gazebo and use it as a starter's hut.

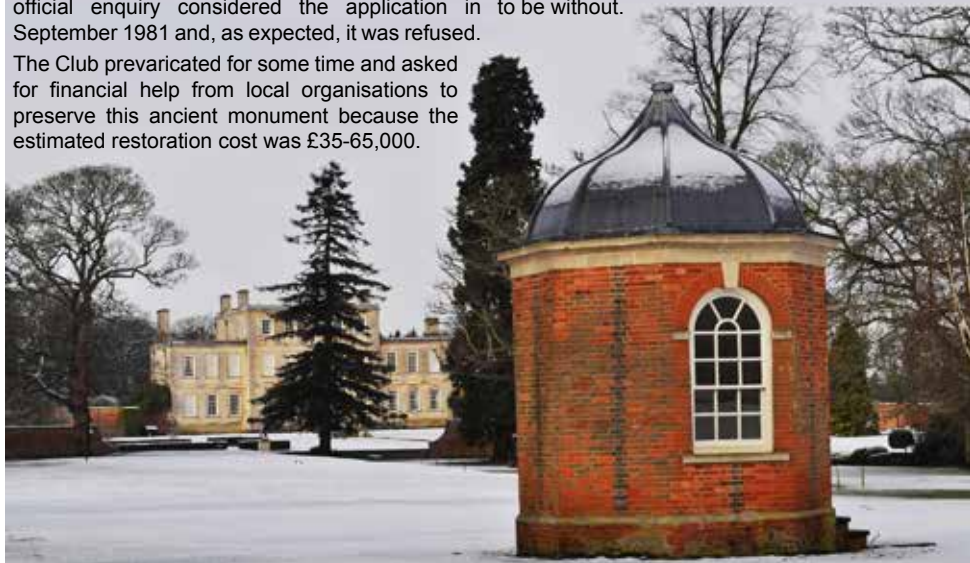
Lord Aberconway even offered to buy it and transport it to Wales but all permissions were refused, except for a relaxation of a demand for special footings.

So the Club was left to fund the restoration with 40% help from English Heritage and £1000 each from the County and Borough authorities.

Specialist contractors were called in. Original materials, bricks, roofing etc, were in short supply so had to be made to order and the project was overseen by historical experts.

The Club, members and officers alike, complained that it was ludicrous to have to spend so much on a 'useless' dilapidated building in the middle of a fairway when the Hall itself was in need of so much restoration work.

Nevertheless, the authorities stood firm, the restoration was completed and now most members and visitors would agree that The Gazebo is a feature of the first hole that they would not wish to be without.
