"A lovely supper of ham, egg and chips was thoroughly enjoyed by everyone followed by birthday cake.


"Sadly this competition coincided with world cup football and was not as well supported, with six ladies having to be balloted out of the competition.

# How to play in the heat? Pro Shop tips

CLUB pro Lee Scarbrow said: "The hot weather has been fantastic, but it has made hitting tee shots straight so important, as the ball is running such a long way.

"If you are struggling with the Driver, why not try a Driving Iron? In this weather, keeping the ball in play is a bit easier with these and we have some you can demo on the course, pop in the shop and give them a try.

"If you are finding chipping and pitching tough in the hot weather with the hard fairways, you may be using too much bounce on your wedge, so pop in and try a wedge with low bounce, this will be easier in the hard conditions. We have both the SM7 wedges from Vokey, plus the Ping glide wedges available to try.

"Please keep hydrated in this weather - start sipping water or other drinks from the early part of your round, do not wait until you feel thirsty as this is too late and you are already starting to dehydrate.

"We will be running our Summer Junior Camps. With all sorts of different dates available, call the Pro Shop to book a place.

"As well as the Junior Camps, we will be running Camps for the Pee Wee age group so call the Shop for details. The Monday Night Club is proving popular and we are always looking for more juniors to join in.

"We will also be running classes for seniors and ladies, call the Shop for details.

"Footjoy have introduced a new shoe called ARC, they are like the ever popular Pro SL'S, just a little easier on the pocket without losing any of the comfort!"

SENIORS Captain Jim Kerr (pictured right) said: "I can't believe we are into July already - can someone please slow time down?


"I thought we were supposed to be retired with loads of time on our hands. I have never been so busy - I am thinking of going back to work for a rest!

# Good weather brings a collection of firsts

STEVE Thompson, who is 2018 Conservation "I ran the Moth Greenkeeper of the Year, said: "For the second trap year in a row two pairs of Kestrels have bred successfully at the club in our two boxes.

"The box on John O'Gaunt had chicks and the box on Carthagena had three, all were ringed by myself (pictured right) and two other licensed ringers on June 19th.

"Hopefully chicks should fledge as there seems to be plenty of food around for them to eat



"The other small boxes for Blue Tits and Great Tits were checked - they were about one or two weeks later than last year. I ringed my last two broods of Blue and Great Tits in early June - they were about eight days old and have since all fledged. Out of the ones I did get to I had over 200 chicks. My best guess would be around 400 altogether.

"The recent hot weather has seen an increase in insect activity, most noticeable at the new pond. It has been amazing for Dragonflies with yet another new species for the club - a Black Tailed Skimmer (pictured below), two males have been seen on several different occasions flying over the pond.



"On June 10th, at least 10 Common Blue Damselflies and two copulating pairs were seen. The Emperor Dragonfly been seen along

the brook a few times but also on the pond where. for the first time, two were spotted.

"Banded Demoiselles have been seen all along the brook and amongst some of the long rough areas and a Common Darter was seen by the tractor sheds and a possible Brown Hawker by the 11th fairway John O'Gaunt - both firsts this year.

too with two new species.

over weekend June and managed to catch an Eved Hawk Moth (pictured riaht)



and on June 21st whilst with an ecologist surveying our wildflower areas we found a Chimney Sweeper Moth which is guite scarce in Bedfordshire.

"Other Moths seen recently during the trapping sessions include the Privet Hawk Moth, which is the largest UK species, Swallowtail, Lackey, Large Elephant, Rosy Footman and many others. The best catch was when we caught nearly 100 moths of over 40 species. Also, while out on that survey, we saw a Cuckoo Bumble Bee, yet another new species for the club.

"Butterflies have been putting in a good showing - seven Speckled Woods by the 16th tee on Carthagena, five Meadow Browns by the seventh tee on John O'Gaunt, and a Large Skipper in long grass near the third green on John O'Gaunt.

"A keen-eyed member spotted the first Marbled White of the year on June 24th by the eighth fairway. Other species seen recently include Large White, Small White, Ringlet, Comma, Red Admiral and Small Tortoiseshell.

"Please keep a look out for all Butterfly species over the summer especially the Purple Hairstreak which is often seen on Carthagena near the 16th tee amongst the Oaks.

"The Grey Wagtail has been seen quite a lot recently, particularly around the pond and near the 13th green. After only a few records of this species, it now seems to be a regular visitor.

"Other birds seen recently: Kingfisher, Skylark (singing only), Whitethroat, two Swallows over the pond on the 10th and a cuckoo was heard calling 9.35pm, a Red Kite was seen flying low over the 18th fairway John O'Gaunt. Young Blue and Great Tits stayed around in the trees near the boxes for a while into early June and could often be heard noisily calling to their parents for more food.
