


When Rory met our Ryan



CLUB pro Ryan Evans made his second appearance in a major, and first on the opposite side of the Atlantic, when he competed in the US Open last month at Shinnecock Hills GC.

The 31-year-old, who made the cut in the Open at Royal Troon two years ago, was unable to match that achievement as he carded two eight-over-par scores of 78 on the notorious difficult layout on Long Island, New York.



After only gaining entry a few days before the event after initially missing out in a qualifying play-off at Walton Heath GC, Evans says he loved the experience and especially the chance to chat to his favourite player Rory McIlroy.

He explained: "I'm quite a big Rory fan, as a lot of people are, and I think what he has done in the game is amazing.

"I can still be a fan, as well as a fellow professional golfer and when I played my first event as a pro four years at the Dunhill Links, I had a quick photo with him.

"On this occasions, I had a US Open flag, which I wanted to get signed, and then get framed with my players badge and locker badge, I did the same as my Open flag. So I just asked him for an autograph and photo and he said 'no problem'.

"I told him it was my first US Open and he initiated a conversation, asking me how I had qualified, what I thought of the venue, then he gave me some advice on how to play the course.

"He told me not to get sucked in by flags. I know he went on to have a bad first day, but it's a course where you don't have to play bad to score bad.

"He was great with his advice. He told me to take my time, don't build up too much pressure and play for the middle of the greens.

"He said if it looks quick it is quick, he said I needed to stay out of the bunkers. He was just really chatty - I must have spoken to him for about 20 minutes.

"For someone who is in the limelight all the time, people constantly asking him for photos or pictures and autographs, I thought it was nice that he gave me 20 minutes of his time. He genuinely wanted to talk.

"They say that it can be a let down when you meet your hero, but this surpassed it. I was told he was a nice guy, but I'd never had the opportunity to talk to him in the player's lounge before. I thought it was really nice of him."

Secrets to raking the new bunkers

WELLINGBOROUGH Golf Club would like to say a big thanks to its greenkeeping staff for all the hard work they have put into maintaining the course and grounds.

With the weather fluctuating from ice and snow, to rain, to showers and now to blistering hot conditions in the space of the last few months, they have needed to deal with a lot.

And when you also factor in that the course has newly re-designed bunkers bedding in, it really has been a challenging time for Steve Mackie and his team.

The Wellingborough green staff are always happy to assist members and guests and are offering the following advice on how to rake the sand traps.





Some players have commented that it is hard to rake the bunkers when they make large, deep footprints having played a shot - particularly in some of the softer, drier sand around the edges of the bunkers.

The rakes we are now using have a dual purpose head. In order to make a better job of repairing the sand and putting it back into a condition suitable for those following, the secret is:

• Having played your shot, always place your club outside the bunker and USE TWO HANDS to hold the rake.

• DO NOT automatically use the side of the rake's head with teeth - use the FLAT side of the rake head and PUSH the sand AWAY, gently smoothing back towards you as required.

- You will find that it is far, far easier to rake those big footprints using this method.
- Still use the toothed side of the rake head when appropriate.
- Experiment with different techniques sometimes one method will work better than another.

The Vaux Family: Mixing with the rich and very famous

WITH Wellingborough Golf Club celebrating it's 125th anniversary in 2018, member David Wilson investigates all the significant changes that have occured at the Club. In the seventh monthly article, he looks at the how the Vaux Family have been involved with all the most powerful people in history.

ON June 5th, 2018 the Club was given a highlydetailed lecture about Harrowden Hall and the Vaux family by Dr. Michael Heaton.

The Club has the Powerpoint presentation on a pdf, which members are able to access by asking the Managing Director.

Briefly though, Harrowden Hall has a very long and distinguished history involving Kings, Queens, Cardinal Wolsey, Father Garnet (the most famous of recusant priests), embassies to the King of France, the Gunpowder and other plots, Catholic recusant families (principally the Treshams) and priest holes.

The various Barons Vaux were involved with all the important and powerful people of history and their stories involve worthies including Shakespeare who in Henry VIII uses Sir Nicholas to take the Duke of Buckingham to the Tower:

Sir Thomas Lovell:

To the waterside I must conduct your grace; Then give my charge up to Sir Nicholas Vaux Who undertakes you to your end.

Sir Nicholas Vaux: Prepare there, The duke is coming; see the barge be ready; And fit it with such furniture as suits The greatness of his person

And who uses a first Baron Vaux poem for lines in 'Hamlet'.

The most detailed book about the Vaux Family is The Vaux of Harrowden by Godfrey Anstruther.

The Barony was created in 1523 for Sir Nicholas Vaux (poet and courtier to Henry VIII and Edward VI). A long period of Abeyance occurred until 1838 when George Mostyn became the sixth Baron.

There was another period of abeyance until 1938 when Grace, the wife of William Gilbey (of the Wine & Spirits business), became the eighth Baroness.

She was succeeded by her eldest son Father Gabriel Gilbey, a Benedictine monk at Ampleforth Abbey who took his seat in the House of Lords in 1962 (the first Benedictine monk to do so since 1559).

His younger brother succeeded to the title and his grandson became the 12th Baron in 2014 being elected to the House of Lords in 2017. The family seat is the Rusko Estate in Kirkcudbrightshire.

The Vaux Family owned Great Harrowden Hall until 1695 when they sold it to Thomas Watson Wentworth, a son of Baron Rockingham, of Rockingham Castle.

Two centuries later, the seventh Baron Vaux was able to buy back the Hall but he left the estate virtually untouched except for the building of the Catholic chapel, completed in 1905, which he had built in Weldon Stone as a copy of Archbishop Chichele's 15th Century Chantry chapel in Higham Ferrers.
