Clubhouse Development - Latest Update

PETER Wade, Chairman Clubhouse Working Group, said: "We are pleased to inform members that full planning consent has now been received from Central Bedfordshire for the detailed plans that were submitted

"These covered the works that had been highlighted on the scrolling display in the Clubhouse foyer during the early part of the summer:

- An extension in keeping with the main building and featuring a slightly larger footprint than the conservatory that it would replace.
- A terrace raised to the house level and extended to accommodate more guests.
- A change to the existing entrance to make it friendly to all members and guests.
- The addition of a storage facility to the Burgoyne suite, enabling the men's toilets to be reinstated and the ladies toilets to be refurbished.

"In addition to these works, there is also the bar refurbishments and fabric repair schedules, but these elements did not require planning permission.

"Since then, the House Sub-Committee has been working with our architects, Vincent and Gorbing Limited, to establish the best way forward now that planning consent has been received.

"We have looked at various alternatives, including 'design and build' and traditional 'architect-led'.

"We have concluded that our needs would be best suited by using an approach that uses the 'architect-led' methodology, but that is modified to make the architect the lead consultant.

"They will then be responsible for selection of other professionals, preparation of tender documents, advice on constructor selection and management of the project through to completion. This approach has now been endorsed by the full General Committee.

"Based upon that we have now commenced a due diligence exercise on the selection of the architect to partner with us for the remainder of the project.

"Naturally, Vincent and Gorbing will be included, but we will also be seeking quotations from other architectural practices.

"Our original hope was that we would be able to start on the works in September 2018. This now looks unlikely to be achieved.

"As part of our planning, we will be looking at disruption mitigation strategies that might enable us to commence work during the latter part of this year or early next year.

"However, if these are unable to support a substantial continuation of the Club's business and activities, it may be necessary to defer commencement to September 2019.

"August is a very busy month for not only competitions but also visiting societies.



By far the best year for several species

STEVE Thompson, who is 2018 Conservation Greenkeeper of the Year, said: "The last few months has seen prolonged hot weather with hardly any rain.

"Whilst this might not be ideal for keeping the golf course very green it has proved to be one of the best years at John O'Gaunt for insects, and not just butterflies or dragonflies.

"In amongst the long grass of the uncut rough areas around the course could be found several insects that you might hear, but probably wouldn't see.

"Meadow Grasshopper, Speckled Bush Cricket (pictured right) and Dark Bush Cricket - one found in the greenkeepers cottage.

"The long dry grass has been a perfect home for them during this hot weather.

"One butterfly that I had not previously seen at the golf club but had been reported to me many years ago on Carthagena and again recently is The White Letter Hairstreak. It is often difficult to identify as it usually flies quite high in the treetops but on July 22nd I saw one on the ninth tee on JOG, I even got it to rest on my finger (pictured).

"This is by far the best year for this species at the club with a similar species, the Purple Hairstreak, doing very well and seen on both sides as well.

"There has been several sightings of Common Blue on JOG and lots of Small White, particularly on Purple Loostrife behind the 13th green on JOG.

"Many other butterflies are also doing well here including Comma, Red Admiral, Speckled Wood, Large White, Gatekeeper, Meadow Brown and three Small Copper, which is the most I have seen together at the club.

"The Brook has been the best place to catch up with Dragonflies with the rather eye catching Banded Demoiselle being the most numerous, often seen in large groups of 12 or more on a hot summer's day.

"This is our best year for sightings of Emperor Dragonfly with numerous records from the brook and sightings on the new pond.

"Migrant Hawkers started to appear in mid-July and can be seen gathering in large groups at the edges of woodland and seen quartering over some of the fairways.

"Again, our best year for sightings of Brown Hawker (a large brown dragonfly) and a freshly emerged female Common Darter was seen on the practice area on July 19th.

"And the last of the insects in this article, Moths. I have been running the moth trap on a few occasions - catching over 100 moths a few times.

"On July 25th, I ran a moth trapping session from 8.15pm till the early hours with some people from the local moth group. We ran five traps on JOG near the 13th green/14th tee, catching about 150+ moths of about 70 species with some still to identify.

"The best of the night was the White Spotted Pinion which is a rare moth that feeds on elm that I usually only see on Carthagena so I was extremely happy to find it on this part of the course.

"If anyone would like a list of the moths we caught on the night please get in touch. We did have one new species for the course Iron Prominent.

"Birds seen recently: Kingfisher, Black headed Gulls on the ninth fairway, Swallow (over the pond), Jays, a family of six Mistle Thrushes on the 15th fairway JOG, Common Buzzard, Kestrel, Green Woodpecker and baby Moorhens in the brook.

"To date there has been one Bat Walk, with another to come on August 21st.

"Please a keep a look out for any Butterflies and Dragonflies as the weather starts to cool.

"And keep a check on the noticeboard and club emails for details of forthcoming Badger Watches and Moth Nights in September and possibly October."
