INCOME

SUBSCRIPTION Income is projected to be slightly INCOME below original Budget.

Whilst recruitment in 2018 has been in line with with a proposed 3% increase year on year. our original target there were more Youth Members than anticipated thus reducing the Financial Result.

However, we are currently recruiting in second Half of the Year and the trend remains positive with all new entrants helping to reduce the gap.

the mix better supported by Societies.

The early course closures, weather related, impacted our Casual Income in guarter one and we have struggled to peg back the lack of course availability.

Bar and Catering projection has been revised to take into account the conditions in guarter one and whilst the revenue numbers will be reduced the contribution to income should remain as Budget.

EXPENDITURE

previous expectations and Departments that are projected to exceed Budget will endeavour to improve their second half performance to mitigate the increases.

Some of the identified overspends are well identified and some are as a result of decisions taken after Budgets were set.

Course will have an have overspend on Irrigation due to the installation of the Aerators in the lake on the fourth hole on the John O'Gaunt Course.

In addition our continued Course development programmes have caused an imbalance on the Percentage of reclaimable VAT.

The upside in Income from Green Fees, due to the Tribunal Judgement, has been made more than offset by the changes to what may be claimed against Course Expenditure.

If we can continue to have favourable conditions for the remainder of 2018 then we fully expect to be at break even or slightly positive on a cash basis by the year end.

In addition Entrance Fee Income in 2018 should yield an additional £40,000 towards the Clubs Development Fund.

2019 BUDGET

SUBSCRIPTION Income has been held in line,

With the removal of the Transfer Fee from 2019 Income there is an even more robust challenge in meeting what is an aggressive target and very dependent on our performance on recruitment and retention.

Green Fee Income will come in on Budget but with Green Fee Income has been held in line with the 2018 projected result.

> We will continue to Increase our Society Income by a continued programme of price increase. Any improved performance on Casual Fees will be an upside.

> Bar and Catering has been held in line with inflationary price increases in both areas. The challenge in Catering is recruitment to replace staff in the second half of 2018. Labour market for staff is extremely tight at present.

EXPENDITURE

OVERALL Expenditure has been in line with our WE have increased Budget for Course to reflect the ongoing need for continuous maintenance programme this includes Machinery which is included in Capital Spend where we have committed to a £60,000 plus investment on additional or replacement items in 2019.

> House Expenditure has been reduced marginally due to the sharing of some labour charges with Course with the potential for some additional savings as the programme develops.

> Administration and Establishment costs do not vary from 2018 projection. There are potentially some additional IT costs as we need to replace our Server which is nearing end of life but we will endeavour to hold within existing Budgets.

> Have previously touched on Capital Spend where we show an increase to £75.000.

> We anticipate some further spend to be required in Kitchen equipment.

> In Summary, with continued success in recruiting Members, focusing on our ongoing new expenditure and increasing where possible other Revenue streams, our 2019 projection should again be neutral or slightly positive.

Course work for late 2018 to early 2019

COURSE WORK:

AFTER one of the driest summers on record, it is obvious what action we need to take.

To start with, we will be scarifying, overseeding and fertilising the fairways on the Carthagena Course - work will commence on Monday, September 10th and weather permitting will be completed within the week.

The same programme of work will take place on the John O'Gaunt Course at the end of September.

We have been implementing this annual maintenance programme for six years and by overseeding with grass species that are able to withstand and recover from drought conditions more quickly.

The greens will be micro cored to a depth of 50mm, scarified to 15mm, overseeded with a Bent Fescue mix, about one tonne of top dressing will be applied per green and fertilised to help the recovery of the sward after what is quite an aggressive maintenance programme.

Tees, approaches, green surrounds and worn area around the bunkers will be hollow tinned, scarified and overseeded, fertiliser will also BUNKERS: be applied to these areas.

> This work is going to cause some disruption, without doubt, to the playing surfaces.

> > The Greens Team will carry out this work as quickly and as efficiently as possible to avoid any disruption of play.

However I would like to point out that this maintenance work is essential, and the co-operation of all members would be appreciated.

WINTER PROGRAMME:

IT is proposed to reconstruct the 13th tee on the Carthagena Course and the 15th tee on the John O'Gaunt Course.

This will involve reshaping, making larger to increase the playing surface, especially the 13th tee on Carthagena, installing new irrigation and re-turfing.

This work may not be started until January 2019 but will be in play for the start of competitions in early March 2019.

Quotations for improving the pathways on both courses to a rubber crumb material will be received by the end of 2018 and then we can plan the work into course improvement plan.

In the meantime, the paths will be kept as tidy as possible. All rough areas will be cut and collected. Trees and scrub areas will be pruned and improved, replanting will take place where needed.

SOME bunkers on the John O'Gaunt Course are in need of renovation work.

This will involve stripping the turf, some subtle reshaping and, in some cases, lowering the front edge of the bunker to allow easier access for golfers and improve maintenance.

Bat's a great start to another lively month

STEVE Thompson, who is 2018 Conservation Greenkeeper of the Year, said: "It was still warm in August providing plenty of insects and food for the bats we have here.

"There were two Bat Walks in August which were both well attended, and I would like to thank everyone that came along.

"The evenings started with a short talk by the local bat expert that came along about bats in general across the world and the UK, followed by a walk round Carthagena on August 7th and John O'Gaunt on August 21st. With the aid of bat detectors, we identified five species.

"On the 21st, I started the evening by saying I wanted to see lots of Daubenton's Bats flying over the new pond. At 9pm when we got to the pond we had exactly what I hoped for, as at least five Daubenton's were seen flying over the pond catching insects. This is a bat I hadn't recorded for a few years at the club and had only ever seen one on its own flying along the brook.

"The new pond really has been fantastic for wildlife this year. Other bats recorded on the two courses were Noctule, Common Pipistrelle, Soprano Pipistrelle, Serotine and a possible Natterers.



"The Badger watches started in August with the first on August 15th through to September 26th.

"All the watches were fully booked and were very popular with several children coming along too.

"At the time of writing, the maximum we had seen was six. I would like to say a thank you to everyone that came along. It puts a smile on my face to see people enjoying the wildlife and many people had never seen a live Badger before.

"The first two weeks of September the weather was still quite warm and saw a mini influx of Common Darter Dragonflies on the John O'Gaunt course. "Several butterflies have been seen recently too, lots of small whites behind the 13th green on John O'Gaunt and the purple Loostrife, Peacock, Red Admiral and a late Holly Blue was seen on August 30th in the new wetland area on the right of the 14th on John O'Gaunt. 2018 has definitely been the year of the insect at John O'Gaunt.

"Some of our summer migrants have still been around during August and early September.

"Swallows over the ninth fairway on August 7th, House Martins over the ninth on John O'Gaunt on August 20th, September 4th and 10th and a Willow Warbler was singing near the 15th fairway on John O'Gaunt on August 31st.

"In case anyone has been wandering what the high-pitched noise was in the 12th green area on John O'Gaunt recently, it was a young Buzzard.

"I am not certain that they nested on the course but probably nested not too far away.

"Other birds seen recently: Green Woodpecker, Kingfisher, young Moorhens in the brook, Mistle Thrushes and a Tawny Owl was caught on one of my trail cameras in September.

"Also, there have been several reports from members of Stoats on Carthagena in recent months.

"What to look for: If the weather stays warm then some of our summer migrants might stay a bit longer, so keep a look out for late staying Swallows and House Martins but also keep an eye out for some of our first returning winter migrants such as Redwing and Fieldfare.

"Please can I ask people to email me if they have seen any Swifts over either course during the summer as I haven't seen any on the courses.

"Keep reporting wildlife and sending in your

sightings, check the noticeboard and club emails for details of any walks. I am hoping to do a fungi foray and a bird ringing demonstration in October."
