MacLaren also won the Nations Cup team prize as she combined with Irish team-mates Webb and Kate Evans to finish ahead of runners-up England.

MARY MacLaren added another The 2019 champion said: "Going into the second day, I wasn't quite sure whether to ignore the scores of my playing partners or keep myself up to date. There were no scoreboards at this event, so I decided to keep count.

> "After being one behind after nine holes, I got myself one ahead early on the back nine, before Minna holed from 15 feet for par on the 15th hole.

> "I had about 12 feet for par so knew I needed to follow her in, otherwise we would be level again fortunately I managed to hole my putt!

> "On the 18th, I was still one ahead of Minna, with Laura a couple behind. On the green, I had about 40 foot left, while Minna had about 25 foot.

> "I putted up to four feet and she left her's stone dead - so I knew what I had to do and happily my putt dropped in the middle.

> "I then found out my 79 was the lowest score of the day, so the title was mine!

> "I've played in this event five or six times and always been there or thereabouts so to finally come out on top was a real thrill; especially as there were some quality players this year.

> "It was a great way start to the year, so fingers crossed this is the first of many trophies in the MacLaren household for 2019 '

#### Did Meg, Ryan and Kyson strike oil in the middle east?

CLUB professionals Meghan MacLaren, Ryan Evans, and Kyson Lloyd have all spent time in the middle east in recent weeks as they look to find top form this season.

MacLaren was in action in the opening event on the 2019 Ladies European Tour as she took part in the Fatima Bint Mubarak Open at Saadiyat Beach GC.

After shooting 75 in the opening round to sit in the top 30, the 24-year-old slipped back with a score of 78, before compiling a level par 72 on the final day to finish in 41st position as former Wellingborough member Charley Hull grabbed the top prize.

The next few weeks are a busy time for MacLaren as she competes in a collection of tournaments in Australia, starting with the ISPS Handa Vic Open in Victoria on February 7th.

With the event making its debut on the LPGA Tour, a strong field will be taking part including British Open champion Georgia Hall, Minjee Lee and Brooke Henderson, who are all in the world's top 10.

MacLaren will return to the LET for the Australian Ladies Classic at Bonville GC, followed by the ActewAGL Canberra Classic at Royal Canberra GC, before she defends her Women's NSW Open at Queanbeyan GC on March 7th.

Both Evans and Lloyd, meanwhile, geared up for their seasons by attempting to grab a place in the Omega Dubai Desert Classic on the Men's European Tour at Emirates GC as they played in a qualifying event on the MENA Tour.

Needing to secure a top three finish at Dubai Hills GC, Evans started brightly with half a dozen birdies in an opening round of 70, before moving up to four-under-par with an eagle on the eighth hole on the last day.

The 31-year-old, who has a European Challenge Tour card for 2019 after competing on the main tour last season, was unable to maintain the momentum as he dropped shots at the ninth, 12th and 18th holes to finish in 16th position.

Evans posted on Twitter: "Enjoyable couple of days playing at @DubaiHillsGolf in the @theMENATour shootout for the @OmegaDDC 70/73 for -1. Not good enough to qualify but it was good fun."

Fellow club pro Lloyd (pictured) saw his hopes of collecting an early 27th birthday present end in qualifying as he carded an opening round of 80, before adding a one-under-par 71.

After working hard on his game over the last few months, Lloyd's tally of five birdies and an eagle, on the fifth hole, on day two will give him confidence going into the season.
