

With a competition scheduled to take place every two weeks, as part of a Junior Order of Merit, it all begins on Sunday, March 10th.

Wellingborough Junior organiser Nigel Grimmitt explained: "All Juniors will book online giving their name, and then sign-in on the day and enter their nine-hole score in the normal fashion

"The format will be a guick information session, followed by a nine -hole stableford competition.

"All players should arrive for 2.30pm where a ball draw will be undertaken in the clubhouse, so all juniors will get a chance to play with new people.

"The stableford winner will receive a £10 youcher achieved then normal entry which will be transferred onto the junior members club card for use in purchasing food/soft drinks, or within the Pro Shop.



The 24-year-old's first career ace came on the eighth hole in a brilliant closing round of five-under-par 67 as she took 22nd in the LPGA Tour event.



Home comforts for Hollingsworth title defence

WELLINGBOROUGH have enjoyed a proud record in NGL team competitions in recent years as the men's, ladies and seniors have claimed the plaudits in county league tournaments. With the 2019 campaign starting this month, this is what our teams have to look forward to in the coming season.

NGL Hollingsworth Trophy

Wellingborough's Hollingsworth Trophy outfit as they begin their title defence with a Group D outing at home to Northampton.

After whitewashing Priors Hall in their opening game 12 months ago, Wellingborough are keen to get off to another flying start as Adam Sherlock's side (pictured below) look to repeat their 2018 win.

The club topped their group last year with three wins out of four, beat Kettering B 4-1 in the semifinals, before landing their second Hollingsworth crown in three years with another 4-1 victory over Farthingstone in the final at Overstone Park GC.

Wellingborough will face familiar foes in the group stages as Kingsthorpe, who have won this competition on a record 13 occasions, and Rushden are in the same section for the second vear in a row. Whittlebury Park are the other side in Group D.

If the team make it through to the semi-finals they will meet the winners of Group A, which includes Northants County, Cold Ashby, Daventry, Priors Hall and Silverstone - the latter two meeting in the opening fixture on Saturday, March 9th.


