

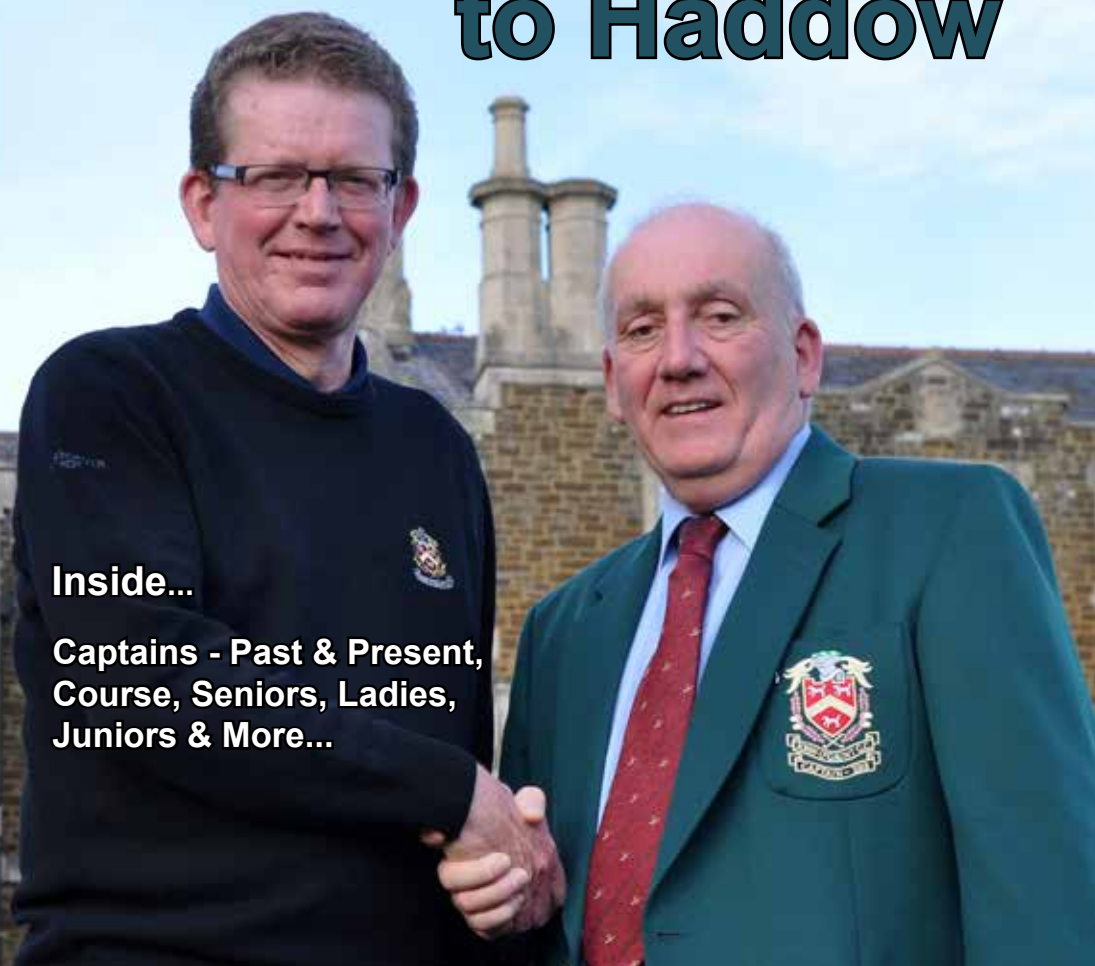

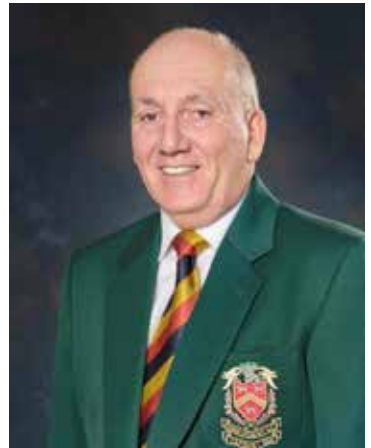

Club Captain Phil Haddow said: "We will have a new General Manager to welcome on board in due course.

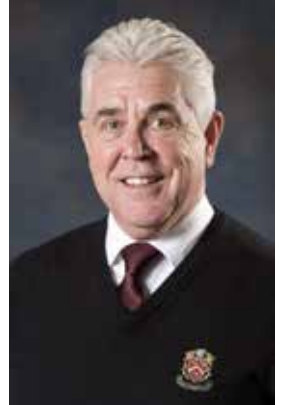
"But please join me in thanking Simon Davis for his hard work over the last 10 years.

"Our juniors played their first match of the year on the Dukes Course at Woburn, winning 3-1.

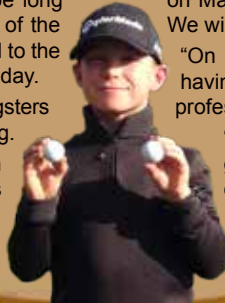

"On Thursday, February 7th, the Senior men joined forces with the Ladies Section for our annual Mixed Greensomes competition. As 40 pairs took to the John O'Gaunt course in windy and cold conditions, the main consolation was the rain stayed away till the very end.

"After the golf, the players enjoyed afternoon tea in the clubhouse, with cakes and savouries kindly supplied by the ladies. This was most welcome, even if it did nothing for my waistline!

"In January, the decision was made to rope off the first fairway on the John O'Gaunt course when golf carts and trolleys were not allowed in order to help the grass recover. In addition, the grass was fed with fertiliser resulting in a fairway that is now in very good condition and the ropes have been removed.

"Nigel (Broadwith - Course Manager) is producing a course work update from time to time and this is posted on the club's website.

"On March 3rd, the Texas Scramble-tacular took place with men's teams in the morning and mixed teams in the afternoon. The day was a great success, and thank you to everyone who took part.

"As the golfing year gets into full swing, competitions will be coming thick and fast so don't forget to keep an eye on competition entry dates.

"Please also watch for notices about men's matches and mixed matches with other club. They are a good opportunity to play with members you may not have met before - it is also a good social event.

First sightings of Waxwings at JOG for years

STEVE Thompson, who was Conservation Greenkeeper of the Year in 2018, said: "The last few months has seen a mixed bag of weather.

"We've had frosts, snow, some rain and strong winds, but also quite warm weather during February, which saw some Butterflies starting to emerge.

"Two Small Tortoiseshells flew out of the workshop down by the greenkeepers sheds and a Peacock was found wintering in an old nestbox that was waiting to be repaired.

"A Herald Moth (pictured right) was also found in the workshop.

"On January 9th, I got a call from a rather excited member who had spotted three Waxwings in the car park in trees by the gardener's garage. I spotted a couple by the entrance the following morning.

"These are the first sightings of Waxwing (pictured below right) at the Club for a few years.

"There has been a lot of activity by Kingfishers recently, several sightings by members and me, mostly from the third green to the 13th green but could be spotted anywhere along the brook.

"John O'Gaunt received a 'Highly Commended' certificate at the Golf Environment Awards for our work on the fourth pond area.

"So any time you are near there, keep an eye out for a Kingfisher - I have had fantastic views of a pair around here on numerous occasions.

"Buzzards have been seen quite often on JOG during the winter. On December 6th, I had a very close encounter with a Buzzard when I found an injured bird behind the 12th green.

"I was able to pick it up and take it to the local vet. Unfortunately it had to be put to sleep. But I felt really privileged to be able to hold such a magnificent bird and to try and do my bit to help.

"Another bird of prey that seems to be doing well is the Red Kite with several sightings recently on both sides, sometimes of two birds.

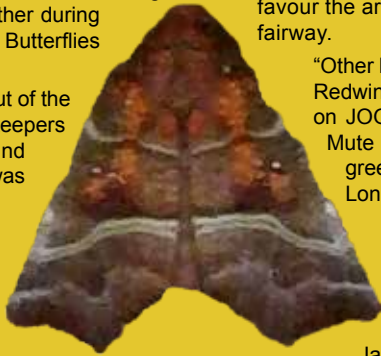
"Kestrels have been spotted by their boxes on both sides with a pair seen mating right next to the box on JOG on February 18th.

"The Little Egret, a once rare bird in the UK (but now breeds here), has been a frequent visitor to John O'Gaunt over the winter months. Just a single bird has been visiting - seeming to favour the area of the sixth tee and 13th fairway.

"Other birds seen or heard recently: Redwing, Fieldfare, Skylark singing on JOG, Siskins, Grey Heron, two Mute Swans flying over the first green on JOG on January 3rd, Long Tailed Tits, Sparrowhawk, Redpolls, Bullfinch, Tawny Owl and possibly a Lesser Spotted Woodpecker heard a few times on JOG.

"In terms of other wildlife, January and February saw an increase in the number of Otter sightings down by the brook, and a Badger was seen in broad daylight running across the practice area towards the 10th green.

"Summer migrants will be returning soon, so keep a look out for Chiffchaff, Willow Warbler, House Martin, Swallow and Cuckoo in the early Spring. Also, more Butterflies should start to emerge as the weather warms up, look out for Brimstone and Orange Tip."
