"Woburn ladies are also visiting Wellingborough for the first time, for a friendly fixture early in May, so I look forward to that match, and us playing at Woburn next year."



Is Solheim Cup spot on the horizon for Meghan?

MEGHAN MacLaren has set her sights on clinching a place in the European team for the 2019 Solheim Cup contest against the USA after continuing her strong start to the season.

The Wellingborough professional backed up her victory in the New South Wales Open in March with a superb runners-up finish in the Jordan Open as she battled it out with male golfers from the European Challenge and Seniors Tours.

After picking up valuable points in her bid to secure an automatic qualifying place, MacLaren's excellent form has alerted team captain Catriona Matthew, who will add four more players to her squad for the match on September 13th.

MacLaren said: "When I woke up on the Sunday morning after the event at Jordan, I had quite a lot of messages on my phone, but one was from a number I didn't have saved.

"It said 'Hi Meghan, it's Beeny (Catriona Matthew), congratulations on your result.' It was unexpected but also quite nice that the Solheim Captain was thinking of me. I'd not had any message before, but it's very early days and she has a lot of people she needs to keep her eye on.

"But just the fact I got a text from her is pretty inspiring really. It's nice to know that I'm on her radar and it will only make me work harder over the coming few months."

Fellow Club Professional Kyson Lloyd enjoyed a brilliant end to his competitive trip to the middle east as he bagged a treble success in the Titleist Black Tee Pro-Am at Saadiyat Beach GC, in the UAE.

The Wellingborough professional, pictured right, smashed the course record on the 7,806 yard layout with a magnificent five-under-par 67 as he won the individual event by four, as well as the team prize.

Lloyd, who made it through MENA Tour Qualifying School in February, had struggled initially during the off-season as he missed the cut in the first four tournaments of the series, before finishing 43rd in the Royal Golf Bahrain Open.

Wellingborough's Ryan Evans begins his European Challenge Tour season with the Spanish Challenge Open on May 2nd, before he competes in the first of two events in the Czech Republic the following week.



Ged and Andrew seal last four spot in extra time

GED Eady and Andrew Loasby (pictured right) booked a last four meeting with Andrew Yearsley and Chris Hartley in the Fish Cup Knockout.

The duo needed to call on all their battling qualities as they grabbed the plaudits in a tight quarter-final with Tony Wheatley and Stuart Philip on the 21st hole.

Paul Webber and Robin Everard beat Alan Lindsay and Nick Reed to set up a semi-final against Wayne Partridge and Daniel Nixon or Jamie Jones and Matthew Francklow.

The last four line-up in the Fish Plates is complete with Andrew Grimmitt and Stephen Etheridge taking on Craig Evans and Roy Pouncey, while Lee Gardner and Peter he combined with Richard Brown to beat Paul Linnitt go head-to-head with Tim Coleman and Colin Armstrong.

Roger Griss was the first player through to the last 16 of the Collier Cup after beating Alan Bird with holes to spare in their second round match.

Stuart Philip was the most impressive winner so far in the second round of the Upchurch Cup as he completed a 5&4 success against Dan Filios.



Grimmitt booked his place in round two, alongside Neil Smith, Mark Smart, Mark Lovesay and Glen Gulla, who defeated Tiger Adams on the penultimate hole.

Gulla and partner Lawrence Berryman were also successful in the opening round of the Grey Jones Coffa TLWS.

Adams, meanwhile, did well to narrowly avoid another KO defeat as he combined with Richard Brown to beat Paul Leeson and Carl Leeson on the second extra hole.

Alan Grey and Tony Camsell joined them in the second round, alongside the pairing of Paul Albery and Neil Redding, who defeated John Cowper and Glenn Harris on the last hole.

In the Watson Cup second round, Andrew Bush got the better of Stuart Philip on the 18th, while in-form Grimmitt and Smith were once again successful.

Johnson beats Doubles partner in Singles final

MIRIAM Johnson lifted the first ladies knockout prize of the year as she edged out doubles partner Gill Rivers on the 18th in the Collier Bowl final.

After beating Mary MacLaren 4&3 in her semi-final tie of the winter competition, Johnson (pictured) did just enough to defeat Rivers, who couldn't quite replicate her magnificent form in the last four when she comfortably beat Patricia Dawson.

Last year's Ladies Captain MacLaren is still involved in the Illingsworth Foursomes after progressing through to the last four alongside Gill Snelson, Gill Spencer and Carol Gibbs are the only other pair through to the semi's.

In the Ladies Handicap Cup, Susan Kellett beat Geraldine Bunyan 3&2 to set up a last 16 meeting with Anne Evans.


That's one El of a start to Lonsdale for Phil
