The Ladies Section was formed in 1929 at Mid Beds Golf Club, which was on Biggleswade Common, and remained active until the club was forced to close due to World War Two.

After the war, the members of Mid Beds Golf Club purchased Sutton Park and renamed it John O'Gaunt Golf Club and the rest, as they say, is history!

In the Carthagena Bowl, three consecutive gross birdies in the middle of the front nine sent Jay Billings and Ben Hull (pictured below right) on the way to victory as the duo finished with 48 points. A strong finish earned second for Thomas Dupuy and Mark Wright (44) by one from four pairings.

JUNIOR Organiser Sue Lee said: "Lots of the juniors have been revising hard for their exams which are nearly over so we hope their results give them their reward.

"We will be glad to see them back with the section, entering the numerous competitions and playing in the various matches coming up.

"We ran the Matt Gentle Memorial Trophy on May 26th. The 10th anniversary of this special event was very well supported with 21 pairs comprising of an adult with a junior or youth player.

"There was a great family atmosphere in the clubhouse for the presentation and one of the family, Matt's Dad, playing with Eleanor Thomas scored a great 38 points.

"It was enough for third behind runners-up Rachel George and Matt George (40). The winners with an amazing tally of 44 were Junior Patron Martin Pettitt and his junior partner Josh Bareham.

"During half term week, we had the Under 14's and Rookies Cup. James Stocks won the Under 14's with 35 points and Lila Belle Nacca won the Rookies with 33.

"We held the annual Patron's Junior Inter Club Trophy at John O'Gaunt on June 9th against teams from Beadlow Manor and The Bedfordshire.

"Unfortunately Leighton Buzzard pulled out at the last minute, so Beadlow and ourselves fielded two teams.

"The format was teams of three with best two scores counting playing off scratch over 18 holes.

"Holders Beadlow's 'A' team came second with 179 but the John O'Gaunt 'A' team of Caitlin Thomas, Joe Clark and James Stocks won with 170.

"Caitlin has also featured in our individual junior successes with a brilliant runner up slot at Bedfordshire Ladies County Championships and she also joins Lawrence Jeffreys at the English Schools National finals on June 24th.

"They both qualified from the South East Schools Championships where Lawrence (pictured right) was Bedfordshire's top boy with a six over par gross score for 30 holes.

"Caitlin was seven over for the 36 holes and finished lin second place. Jess Sporle also represented Bedfordshire in this competition and although not getting to the finals she has had a great season and seen her handicap come down from 14 to nine this year.

"We of course have lots of higher handicap juniors and new recruits that we are encouraging to play in our competitions.

"And we continue to have roll ups with our less experienced juniors going out for a few holes on the Carthagena Course.

"We hope very soon to be able to have some beginners competitions on the blue course. "There is lots to be optimistic about in the junior section at John O'Gaunt Golf Club."




Davis ends years of loyal service as Club General Manager

"The single competition played was the Ken Robinson Texas Scramble, played to the Marquis of Queensbury rules, which our organiser kindly had printed on the scorecard so nobody was in any doubt as to who could play what shots. As nobody was disgualified this must have worked ok.



"The weather held fair, and a close result ended with the team of Keith Blankley, Gordon Goodchild, Richard Munns and myself narrowly losing to Jack Shepherd, John Sandland, Colin Fox and Geoff Stevens.

"It was nice, unless you were playing in it, to see some rain falling on the courses in recent days which is most welcome in the guest to recover from the dry summer, autumn and spring we have just endured."

IN the second of a series of short features on the history of the Seniors Section at John O'Gaunt, 2019 Captain Dave Gauge looks back at how it has developed over the years.

Gauge explained: "Last month I dealt with how the senior section was born. This month we will briefly look at the ensuing years of development.

"After its inception, one of the first things that was attempted was to arrange matches against other local clubs.


"This did not prove easy at first as not many clubs at that time had an organised Senior Section. It appears even then, John O'Gaunt was leading the way.



"One of the first matches was against Harpenden Common (pictured above), a match still in force today, where members thought it was relatively flat and not too difficult.

"As the section, grew it became necessary to have a secretary. The first in this role was John Freedman who served for a total of eight years.

"As well as matches John got agreement from the committee to hold internal competitions. The first of these was the Annual Medal Trophy in 1979, for which John donated the trophy. This is still played for to this day."

Record bird numbers and rare insects in Spring

CONSERVATION Greenkeeper of the Year Steve "It was quite a warm Thompson said: "It's been an amazing time for day and numerous birds in the nestboxes on both courses.

"I started checking the boxes towards the end of April and was already finding nests with eggs in. Breeding was starting early this year.

"I ringed the first broods of 10 Blue Tits and seven Great Tits (pictured) on May 6th and continued



until May 28th when I ringed the last brood of four Blue Tits.

"The total so far is 512 - a recordbreaking year. This includes a record 174 Great

Tits, 326 Blue Tits, four Jackdaws, one Stock Dove, two Tawny Owls and another first - five Kestrel chicks (pictured below) in the Carthagena box, which were ringed on May 29th.

"They all appeared to be healthy and will hopefully fledge towards the end of June making it our most successful Kestrel box to date.

"When checking the boxes, I managed to catch most and we ringed 340 chicks, which is nearly double our previous best - fingers crossed they all survive.

"Insects too have had a fantastic time recently, including on May 24th, when a rather strange looking insect was found in the clubhouse and I was called to investigate.

"I sought expert advice from an Entomologist. It turned out to be a House Centipede, a "Lastly, after an early morning Dawn Chorus

Mediterranean species and the second ever record for Bedfordshire and only handful of records in the UK, so a very rare insect indeed.

"Unfortunately, the Centipede did not survive but it will be sent to the Royal Entomological Societies HQ in Berkshire

to add to their official collection of specimens.

"Another new species for the club and me was a Four Spotted Chaser (a dragonfly species) seen flying over the brook in front of the fourth tee on June 6th, that is now the 15th species of dragon/ damselfly recorded at the club.

other Dragonflies were about in the same area: Blue Tailed Damselfly right), (pictured



Common Blue Damselfly, Large Red Damselfly, Black Tailed Skimmer and Banded Demoiselle. Just six species on a short stretch of water, amazing!

"Butterflies have been about in good numbers too. The best was a Small Heath seen on the seventh fairway on Carthagena at the start of June, this is a new species for me at the club and makes 24 species now recorded here.

"Other species seen recently include Speckled Wood, Brimstone, Holly Blue, Orange Tip, which was last seen on June 3rd, and Peacock.

"Another remarkable sighting was on June 7th, when I saw a Stoat running across the sixth fairway John O'Gaunt with a Starling in its mouth, I have never seen a Stoat catch a bird before. There have been numerous other sightings of Stoat on both sides recently.

"More of our summer migrants had arrived by mid-May, the first Swallows were sighted on May 7th and Swifts were seen two days later.

"A single Sand Martin was reported on Carthagena in early June, Whitethroat singing regularly on the edge of the practice area and a Cuckoo continued to call until the end of May. Unfortunately, the Willow Warbler has not returned to John O'Gaunt.

Walk, whilst walking across the practice area I briefly heard a Sedge Warbler singing by the greenkeeper's sheds. Only the second record for the club and not the habitat where you would normally expect to see it.

"What to look for; Dragonflies anywhere along the

during hot weather, any Butterfly species, Kestrel, Whitethroat, Sand Martin, Swallow, Swift, Stoat and flocks of Starlings.

"Please continue to report wildlife sightings either via the noticeboard or be contacting me on steve@johnogauntgolfclub.co.uk."
