
It's a hard life being a Tour professional... honestly!

After posting three birdies in a two-overpar 77 to lead by nine after the opening round, the Irish Ladies international was a




model of consistency on the second day as she dropped just two shots in a round of 76.




Wellingborough 20 Oundle 0
