As you can see with the photo below, I am in desperate need of a haircut, which the wife is about to tackle with her horse clippers. Wish me luck.




As lockdown measures are eased and we are finally allowed to organise social events, we do intend to run events at short notice as measures allow.

Updated details on playing golf

Tee time format (early June):

• Monday, June 1st from 7.30am: 18 holes from first tee or 10 holes from ninth tee. Two balls only from both tees for the first hour, then up to four players permitted for the remaining tee times off the first tee only.

• Tuesday, June 2nd from 7.30am: 18 holes from first tee or 10 holes from ninth tee. Two balls only from both tees for first hour, then up to three players permitted for the remaining tee times off the first tee only.

• Wednesday, June 3rd from 7.30am: Same as Monday.

• Thursday, June 4th from 7.30am: Eight holes from first tee or 10 holes from ninth tee. For the whole day, two balls only permitted for all tee times.

- Friday, June 5th from 7.30am: Same as Monday.
- Saturday, June 6th from 7.00am: Same as Monday, except starting tee time.
- Sunday, June 7th from 7.00am: Same as Monday, except starting tee time.

With assessments being made on a regular basis, please note Coronavirus guidance could change so please keep up-to-date with the lastest advice.

Key Items Of Note:

• A member may book multiple playing partners into their own chosen tee time, but no other tee times.

- Both block booking of tee times or play before the first stipulated tee times are not permitted.
- If they so wish, members may book only one, two or three names into a four ball tee time slot.
- Playing in fours is not obligatory. Similarly, playing a full 18 holes from the first tee is not mandatory, although it is preferred.

• Most importantly, the policy of not pre-booking consecutive days is to remain. Please respect this. Consistent abuse of this simple rule will leave the club with no option but to deal with accordingly.

- · Members' guests are not permitted at this time to be kept under constant review.
- WGC's membership is almost full for male members and it is likely that a waiting list may be required in the near future, so please let those know that may be considering joining.
- Applications for ladies and any junior memberships are still very welcome.
- The Club's updated COVID-19 guidelines have been e-mailed to all members.

James set to pass on psychological knowhow

WELLINGBOROUGH Golf Club's members returned to the golf course last month after a long period of inactivity under coronavirus lockdown. James Whittemore is keen to get their games back in shape as quickly as possible, so we chatted with our Assistant Club Professional to find out how he will help.

What have you done during lockdown?

I've done a lot on TikTok! In all seriousness, I have done a bit of chipping in my garden to keep myself fit and I've completed an on-line university psychology course, which was good. The mental side is huge in golf.

What did that involve?

It was an eight-part course covering the mental aspect of golf and how people get around the golf course. It covered how they approach each hole, their mental status with shots in hand, preshot routines, visualisation and finding outcome based goals. It's stuff that I knew and had learnt in the past so it was a bit of a refresher, but there were new aspects too.

Who is it aimed at?

Golfers at any level from the very best like Ryan (Evans), Meghan (MacLaren) and Charley (Hull) to a high-handicapper - it's still the same thing. The outcome is very different, but you can still set specific targets, and try and achieve them.

Have you started using this in your lessons?

Yes, but I haven't done any playing lessons yet, which is tricky because the key is to see the players on the golf course. But the course is packed so it's not been easy to find time to play.

What coaching are you allowed to do?

Group coaching has been out, but I've been doing one-to-one coaching, abiding by the twometre rule on the practice ground, the chipping area and the putting green. The indoor studio has also been out of action, but I'm looking to continue running the programmes I ran before.

What response have you received for lessons?

I received an influx of lesson requests at the end of May as people realised they could get out on the golf course. We obviously need to get competitions started so it gives them something to focus towards. I had a new lady start with me on May 27th and a lad over the weekend, I have another new lady next week. They are on continuous courses, so it's a good sign that they are coming for lessons.

How can a member book on a programme?

For anyone interested, there is a free assessment, when I'll get them in for 45 minutes to an hour - I will look at their swing, we will have a chat, and put together a plan for their goals for the season. Programmes start from £189, over three months. This includes coaching and on-line work, normally there would also be group sessions, but we'll have to wait and see on that.

Crucial coronavirus decisions are made in a Zoom

THE social media video platform Zoom has become a 'friend' of Wellingborough Golf Club in recent weeks as it has been used to hold frequent meetings to organise the club's response to the coronavirus outbreak.

The COVID-19 Group, which consists of lan Ferris (Chairman), Steve Munns (Finance Director), Chris Billson (Course Chairman), David Waite (General Manager), Dave Hawkins (Club Captain) and Jenny Wilkinson (Lady Captain), first met on March 17th.

At that stage, it was decided that Wellingborough had little option but to shut the clubhouse, which was soon followed by a directive on March 23rd from governing body England Golf to close the golf course.

Since then the COVID-19 Group have continued to meet on Zoom at least



once every week as they take in the latest information from the Government and England Golf. Waite said: "We'd never used Zoom before, but it has been helpful for the Group to discuss and work on a wide range of topics ranging from furloughing staff, maintaining the golf course in the best condition possible during lockdown and then getting everybody back to playing golf again.

"In recent days, there has been a further relaxation on the number of golfers per group which gives us the opportunity to take the pressure off the booking system. Once permitted, we are looking forward to hopefully initiating a return to providing a bar and food service at the Club.

"We'd like to thank everybody for their patience and understanding through this trying time and we look forward to a safe return to 'normality' in the fullness of time."



'Chilled out' Ryan ready for competitive return

EUROPEAN Challenge Tour professional Ryan Evans (pictured) has relished the unexpected opportunity to spend a long period of time at home for the first time in a decade.

The 33-year-old, who married long term girlfriend Toni in December last year, says the coronavirus lockdown has provided a good chance to recharge the batteries but admits he is now itching to get back out on Tour playing competitive golf once again.

The Wellingborough pro said: "It was nice to spend a couple of months at home, because I've played golf competitively for 10 years or so, when I'm away for probably 30 weeks each year.

"I saw it as a time to chill out, spend some time with my wife and do the house up a bit. It was good to be at home, but I'm itching to get out there playing now.

"My practice during lockdown was limited to hitting balls into a bed sheet in the back garden and I also have a putting green, so I did a lot of practise there. Now I'm just practicing on the course.

"I don't know when tournaments are going to start. We are scheduled to start in mid-July but it is all dependent on travel, can we go into these countries? Then, do we have to quarantine? And promoters and sponsors might pull out.

"So I'm just going to have to practice and play most days, in case they turn around and say 'right, we're going'.

"I can't switch to domestic events purely because there aren't any in this country.

"I know the European Tour has set up some tournaments in a 'UK Swing', but I have no idea if that involves me because that is the European Tour.

"So unless the Challenge Tour try and get five or six events in this country, and then get everyone over here, which would be great, there is nothing to play at present.

"The guys who had cards on the EuroPro had the whole schedule cancelled, so we would be quite fortunate if we get between five and 10 events this year.

"We are all in the same boat - we just don't know. We need to get ourselves mentally and physically ready."

> Men's sport dominates primarily because in the beginning and ever since, people with power (...men) chose to invest in it.



New restrictions assisted our greenkeepers

HEAD Greenkeeper Steve Mackie says the initial COVID-19 rules helped his team keep the Wellingborough course in superb condition following the resumption of play last month.

Although a number of the Harrowden Hall greenkeeping staff remain off work on the furlough scheme, Mackie believes the larger gaps between tee times and smaller group sizes has enabled the rest of the team to keep on top of the workload.

He said: "It was good to see the golfers back out there, but when it was just us greenkeepers out there, we could do what we wanted, where we wanted and when we wanted.

"So we've needed to adapt to fitting back in with the golfers. Having said that, the longer 10-minute intervals, and the fact they were two balls, has helped us find opportunities - everyone we have spoken to loves this.

"It's still packed out there on the course, but when you have a four ball, following a four ball, following a four ball, the golf slows down, so normally there aren't too many gaps for us to work.

"The course opening announcement didn't really make too much difference to us because we were doing everything as normal anyway.

"We were planning for when we needed to take the flag poles out and arrange pin placement charts, so it was no major problem.

"We did do an over-seed on the greens, which we sneaked into the time delay before the return, but that only took us three days.

"The course was open within a week so it just worked out with the timings that the greens were a little bit bumpy to start off with, but they are fine now. We could perhaps do with a little rain, mind you!"
