



Extraordinary General Meeting (EGM)

Thursday, July 19th, 2018

JOHN O'Gaunt Golf Club held its Annual General Meeting (AGM) on March 29th, 2018.

The purpose was to elect the officers and committee members for 2018-19, adopt the Treasurer's Report and Statement of Accounts for the year ending December 31st, 2017, adopt the Captain's Report and elect Streets Accountants as our independent accountants.

In accordance with the club's constitution, the quorum for a General Meeting (GM) shall be 100 members eligible to attend and vote, excluding



members wishing to exercise a postal vote. Unfortunately, only 53 voting members were in attendance.

Following a decision by those present, the meeting went ahead with the election of officers and committee members, adoption of the Treasurer's Report, and Statement of Accounts, adoption of the Captains Report and election of Streets Accountants as our independent accountants, all duly ratified.

Notwithstanding that, poor attendance at AGMs has been a recurring theme over recent years, and your current committee are uncomfortable with their present position.

It goes without saying that members would wish for the Club to continue to function on a day to day basis and that will continue.

However, to bring the Club into compliance with its constitutional requirements and having taken legal advice, your committee, in accordance with the constitution, have called an EGM for 20:00 on Thursday, July 19th, 2018.

At the EGM, the following will be required:

- A minimum of 100 members eligible to attend and vote will need to be in attendance.
- Reaffirm your current officers of the Club for 2018-19.
- Reaffirm your current committee of the Club for 2018-19.
- Adopt the Treasurer's Report and Statement of Accounts for the year ending December 31st, 2017.
- Adopt the 2017-2018 Captain's Report.
- · Reaffirm Streets Accountants as our Independent Accountants.

In addition, the following proposition will be put forward:

Rule 4.03: The Quorum for a General Meeting shall be 100 Members eligible to attend and vote, excluding Members exercising a postal vote.

At a General Meeting where fewer than 100 eligible, voting members are in attendance, the meeting will be closed. Within seven days, another Annual General or Extraordinary General Meeting will be called at which those eligible, voting members in attendance will be deemed to form a quorum.

Please note that it's not the intention to revisit discussions held at the original AGM. As always, the Treasurer and General Manager are available to discuss any issues or concerns members have relating to either the finances or club matters in general.

Your Committee have agreed to overhaul the process by which future AGMs are notified and more importantly, marketed to the membership, in order to mitigate the prospect of this situation occurring in the future.

Your attendance at the EGM would be greatly appreciated.

"The ladies enjoyed a delicious salad lunch and supper and I received many compliments for Marcus and Dawn and their teams in our catering department. Thank you all.


"At the end of the month, the May Ping Fourball Betterball competition was won by Jean Cobb and in-form Sandra Gardner with a fantastic 44 points between them.

Paul and John keep rolling back the years

PAUL Wharton and John Kemp proved that age is no barrier to success after the two experienced golfers wrote their names in the John O'Gaunt record books with winning displays in separate events.

Wharton carded a gross score of 75 to add the 2018 Seniors Club Championship to the Men's crown he won last year - becoming the first player to hold both titles at the same time.

After finishing three ahead of runner-up Bob Bage, he also became the first member to win the three - Junior Club Championship, Club Championship and Senior Championship - in John O'Gaunt's 70-year history.

By contrast, Kemp needed to wait considerably less time for his defining moment as he became the first person to card a hole-in-one on the re-designed fourth hole on the John O'Gaunt course.

With the hole having been modified during the winter, the former club member (pictured right), who now competes on the European Senior Tour, found the bottom of the cup in the Club Pro-Am as he went on to claim victory with a three-under-par 68.



How to make the best of our great courses?

COURSE and Golf Committee Chairman Pauline Aubigne said: "This year we have gone from the Beast from the East to one of the hottest Mays on record. The courses are in amazing condition and certainly challenging in places!

Nigel and the team have been planting new trees between the sixth and seventh fairways on the John O'Gaunt Course, and on the 11th near to where the old willow tree was up until a few years ago.

It has been agreed that agration will be installed in the pond on the fourth hole with a small fountain at each end - this should be a great addition and enhance the look of this feature even more.

Both courses are very busy at the moment, especially with knockouts. If you do have players behind you who are playing in matches they will normally be playing quickly and we would ask that you stand aside and let them through please. This will make your game and theirs more enjoyable.

On the subject of competitions, could you please ensure that when you sign-up that you have checked your diary to make sure you are available to play. Once you have signed up, if you realise you are unable to play, please contact Administration as quickly as possible. Some competitions have reserve lists and this will allow a replacement to be entered.

If you are unable to play on the day of the competition you must contact Administration or the Pro-Shop - if you do not follow this procedure and are registered as a 'no show' you could find yourself being banned from some future competitions.

When you are playing in a competition and for some reason you are unable to continue, you must report to the person looking after the competition that day, either a member of Administration or Course and Golf. Please do not just walk off the course! Again you could find yourself being banned for not following the correct procedure.

From time to time there are notices posted asking for members to take part in men's, ladies or mixed matches against other clubs. These matches can be good fun. For all 'new' members, this is a great chance to meet and play with other members you may not have met and to have a great afternoon and play other courses. Please keep an eye out for these notices on the boards in the members bar (19th hole) and in the downstairs foyer.

Just a reminder to everyone, please help us to keep our courses in great shape by replacing divots, repairing pitch marks and raking bunkers. In addition, please ensure that you take notice of signs around the course showing where trolleys and golf buggies can go, and please ensure that you check the noticeboards for course closures.

Finally, enjoy your golf - have a great game on our great courses.

Birds of prey make home at John O'Gaunt

STEVE Thompson, who is 2018 Conservation "Other birds seen or heard recently include Greenkeeper of the Year, said: "After the cold wet start to Spring it warmed up during May and the butterflies started to appear; Small Whites, Large Whites and Green Veined Whites, several Orange Tips Brimstone, Peacock and Holly Blue.

"As we go through the summer months, the weather will get warmer and you should see more.

"Keep a look out for Marbled White and Purple Hairstreak on Carthagena but also Small and Large Skipper, Red Admiral, speckled Wood and any other Butterfly.

"Look at patches of Bramble you might come across which often has lots of butterflies on or any of the wildflower areas on John O'Gaunt, A member spotted an Orange Tip there on April 14th - this is the first record for this species in Bedfordshire in 2018.

"Another insect that likes the warm weather is the Dragonfly. Look out along the brook during the summer months for Banded Demoiselle (male is small and blue with dark patches on the rings), Large Red Damselfly and, on particularly hot days, you might be lucky enough to see an Emperor Dragonfly.

"This year's sightings started early on May 9th with a new species for the club (and for me). A female Broad bodied Chaser was spotted near the 15th tee on John O'Gaunt.

"It's been a good time for birds recently too. A member reported a Hobby near the 11th green John O'Gaunt in late April - not a bird I see very often on either course.

"Up to eight Greylag Geese have been seen wandering around John O'Gaunt on the fairways or rough areas but also in the new wet area by the side of the 14th fairway.

> "There has been many more sightings of Grey Wagtail on John O'Gaunt around the new pond and one sighting in mid-May of an adult male carrying what looked like food near

> > the 14th bridge. It could be a new breeding bird for the club but as, vet I have not found a nest.

Cuckoo, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Buzzard, Kestrel (pictured bottom left) and Grey Heron.

"All the nestboxes were checked by mid-May. I found that birds were much later this year with a lot of nests with eggs and some on very young chicks only a day or two old. I will give a report on numbers etc in the next newsletter.

"On May 16th, I was with a fellow ringer and we went to check a Stock Dove Box near 15th fairway on Carthagena. I never check this box on my own as it has had Tawny Owl nest in it before. Last year they had two eggs but they both failed.

"With safety in mind, I went up the ladder wearing a face shield to protect my face just in case.

"When I lifted the lid, I was amazed by what I found - two Tawny Owl chicks of three to four weeks old (pictured below). The chicks leave the nest at about 28 days before they can fly, it's called Branching. So we got to them just in time.



"This is the best success I have had with Tawny Owls in a box with one chick ringed a few years ago in the same box.

"The two Kestrel boxes were checked at the end of May. The box behind 17th green on John O'Gaunt had five eggs and the box on Carthagena near 16th fairway had two chicks (just hatched) and two eggs. These will be checked again later in June and I hope the eggs all hatch.

"Please keep a look out for any Swifts, House Martins or Swallows flying around the course, any Butterflies or Dragonflies particularly along the brook. The 16th tee on Carthagena is the best place to see Purple Hairstreak.

"There are plans for Bat Walks in early August and possibly Badger watches in August and September. So keep a look out for emails from the club or posters on the noticeboard."
